## CHAPTER 15

## GOVERNMENT GAZETTE (PUBLICATION)

Ordinance No. 17 of 1930, AN ORDINANCE TO DISPENSE WITH THE NECESSITY FOR PUBLICATION OF CERTAIN MATTERS IN THE GOVERNMENT GAZETTE.

[15th November, 1930.]

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Government Gazette (Publication) Ordinance.

Power to annul provisions of written law requiring publication or the Gazette.

2. (1) It shall be lawful for the Minister, after consulting the Minister in charge of the subject of Justice, by Order published in the Gazette, to declare that any provision of proclamation in written law with the administration of which he is charged and which requires that any matter or thing, or any order, notification, list, statement, abstract, notice, or other document, shall be published or proclaimed, or published by Proclamation, in the Gazette, shall cease to be in force as from a date to be specified in such Order.

(2) All Orders made under this section shall be laid, as soon as conveniently may be. on' the table of Parliament at two successive meetings of Parliament and shall be brought before Parliament at the next subsequent meeting held thereafter by a motion that the said Orders shall not be disapproved, and if upon the introduction of any such motion, or upon arty adjournment thereof, the said Orders are disapproved by Parliament, such Orders shall be deemed to be rescinded as from the date of such disapproval, but without prejudice to anything done already thereunder; and such Orders, if not so disapproved, shall continue to be of full force and effect. Every such disapproval shall be published in the Gazette.
